## UNDERGRADUATE TRANSCRIPT KEY

Binghamton University operates on a year-round schedule that includes a fall and spring semester, as well as winter and summer sessions.

Binghamton has five undergraduate schools: Harpur College of Arts and Sciences, School of Management, Decker College of Nursing and Health Sciences, Thomas J. Watson College of Engineering and Applied Science, College of Community and Public Affairs. The descriptions that follow explain the transcripts for each of these undergraduate schools and the information noted thereon.

The Graduate School administers all advanced degree programs offered in College of Community and Public Affairs, Decker College of Nursing and Health Sciences, Harpur College of Arts and Sciences, School of Management, Education, School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences, and the Watson College of Engineering and Applied Science. Graduate work appears on a separate transcript.

All transcripts include notations for academic standing (institutional honors, probation, suspension, or dismissal.)
